Lesson 2 – How to read the book – sentences

Preliminary work

- I. Read entire book in one setting (if possible) to get an idea of the context of your target passage
- II. Identify How wide is the river is that divides us from the original recipients
 - a. Who wrote the book and who was it written to?
 - b. What was their situation, covenant, culture, language, etcetera...?
- III. Choose your target passage and observe what it says
 - a. <u>It is important to note that at this point we are not making application yet</u>. We are simply observing what the writer originally wrote to the original recipients.
 - b. Make as many observations as possible about your target passage.

What to make note of

- **I. Repetition of words or phrases -** Once you have identified the repeated words, examine the way that those words are used. What modifying words are used with those repeated words?
- **II. Contrasts -** Differences between two or more things.
- **III. Comparisons -** Similarities between two or more things.
- **IV.** Lists Explore the significance. Is there an order? Are there groups?
- V. Cause and effect Identifying cause and effect can help us establish risks and rewards for actions.
- VI. Figures of speech These are images in which words are used in a sense other than the normal, literal sense.
 - a. Ask yourself: "What image is the Author trying to convey with the figure of speech?"
- **VII. Conjunctions -** The small words that connect the bigger words together. How do these modify our understanding of the larger words used?
- VIII. **Pronouns -** These replace Nouns. Pay attention to what the pronoun is referring to (the Antecedent).
- **IX.** Verbs where all the action is What kind of verb is used (Past, present, future). Are they active or passive?
